MISSION STATEMENT

Medfield High School, in partnership with family and community, promotes both integrity and excellence in scholarship and citizenship for all learners.

Medfield High School is a comprehensive and rigorous high school, serving close to 900 students, grades 9-12. The student population is served by 85 faculty members. Students take 7 classes, which generally meet 4 times a week. Students are fully scheduled each day and do not have study halls. Our program of studies can be found on our website. MHS has an extensive commitment to providing students with a learning environment in which they can grow and develop in the 21st century through technology integration in the classroom.

LEVELING INFORMATION

Courses at Medfield High School are offered at the Honors (H), College Prep 1 (C1), and College Prep 2 (C2) level for freshmen and sophomores. In addition to these levels, juniors and seniors, may take courses at the advanced placement (AP) level. Courses at all levels align with the state curriculum frameworks but differences occur in the pacing, depth of coverage, and independent study required.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT OFFERINGS

Sixteen AP level courses are offered: Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Economics, English Language & Composition, English Literature, Environmental Science, French, Physics II (Algebra based), Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, Studio Art, US Government & Politics, and US History.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must pass a minimum number of full year courses or their equivalency according to the chart listed below:

GRADE POINT AVERAGES

Each Medfield High School student is provided two GPA profiles and decile rankings, weighted and unweighted. The GPA is only calculated at the end of the semester and is based on a 4.0 scale.

The GPA is calculated by utilizing the grades earned in all courses with the exception of Pass/Fail courses, Skill Development, and special programs. The weighted GPA profile is calculated by providing students with an additional 0.8 for full year courses and 0.4 for all semester courses taken at the honors or advanced placement (AP) level. The GPA of students who transfer to Medfield High School only reflects work completed at Medfield High School. To be included in the decile ranking system, students must have completed a minimum of three semesters at Medfield High School.
